VICAR'S MESSAGE

The Apostles' Month

The month of June is the "Apostles' Month". From 16th to 29th all the Apostles are remembered and honored with a lent time and June 29th the lent ends with the festival of the sacred memory of Sts. Peter and Paul. The Apostles are a great attraction and inspiration to all at all times because they could follow truthfully the 'way of Christ'. They were not well educated, financially rich or politically influential persons. Neither were they people of any special caliber or talent except that they were good fishermen and maybe St. Mathew being a tax collector was good at math! According to the Gospels Judas Iscariot was in charge of the "purse" and may not have had much money to operate like modern humanitarian workers or evangelists! Therefore, generally the Apostles are just ordinary folks who blindly followed the Lord. Under their leadership and witness the Church grew. The Bible witnesses, (Act 4)"32 All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had.33 With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all34 that there were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned land or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales 35 and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone who had need." There were no psychologists to counsel them, no economist to advise them, no rich man to feed them, no large companied that employed them

It was not just co-incidental that the Lord selected these inefficient followers but it was the Lord's careful plan. In God there are no accidents or unexpected happenings. Everything is in the plan of God. The Lord found that the inefficient people in the eyes of the world are the best whom He can train because they were obedient disciples. The only one person who had some developmental, humanitarian or managerial vision was Judas Iscariot but his plans did not work. He proved that human plans outside the will of God are futile. The Lord could not train Judas that much as his eyes were pointed to material gain for the Lord. Many



times Jesus made it clear to them all but still Judas hoped that Jesus the true Son of God will succeed in overcoming all worldly powers. He knew well how Jesus overcame temptations. Also he knew how Jesus could control every human situation and the nature, no matter what it was: sickness in body or mind, death, natural calamity, hunger, thirst and so on. Therefore Judas' dreams for Jesus was purely worldly. None of his expectations worked out as Jesus' was purely from the point of view of the Kingdom of God. At the same all other Apostle made the difference in their obedience to the Lord.

In the Kingdom of God the ordinary people are more efficient because they were willing to be trained for the Kingdom of God. We know how afraid were the Apostles the moment Jesus died on the cross. Even after resurrection they did not regain their courage in spite of continuous appearances of the Lord. The sporadic absence of Jesus made them weak. When Jesus was always with them, they did not worry. But when the Holy Spirit came on them, they felt the continuous presence of the Lord with them and they became courageous. And they became the most dedicated workers of the Lord's vineyard.

It is interesting to notice that when the Lord selected the Apostles, they were given specific duties. Matthew 10:5 onwards we read, "These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. 6 Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. 7 As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' 8 Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy,[a] drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give." We can itemize all those duties:

I. Go to the people of Israel (to preach to their own community)

- 2. Proclaim the message of the Kingdom of Heaven (the concept of heaven is over against the kingdom of this world, which means it was not a quantitative kingdom but a qualitative one where there is only love, joy and peace as the goals in life)
- 3. Heal the sick (both in mind and body; somehow the hospitals took over this job these days!)
- 4. Raise the dead (The Apostles did it after Christ)
- 5. Cleanse the lepers (socially outcast people to be brought back to the society)
- 6. Drive out demons (heal those who are mentally ill or spiritually sick. People who are under the influence of Satan to be cleansed)

Which of the above duties need money, power, authority, influence or any material resource? None.

Simply dedication, commitment, obedience of the Word of God, prayer and trust in God and so on are needed to carry the mission that Christ gave us. Today's Church is seeking all kind of material resources and there is a lot of material resource but where is the wellbeing of our people? Can we see the Kingdom of God among us? The apostles experienced the kingdom of heaven where God is the real experience. The apostolic time challenges us today. Who will accept this challenge?

In this month of the Apostles, let us ponder the Apostolic Church that lived in fullness of the power of the Holy Spirit.

Gorilla, Cow and Man!

One of the most recent events that gained national attention in US was the 4 year old falling in to a cage where Gorillas were kept, in Cincinnati Zoo. The encounter resulted in the gorilla that belonged to an endangered species being killed in order to save the child. Discussions are happening in news channels and social media about this case, with many arguing against the killing of the gorilla, named Harambe, which belonged to an endangered species. A facebook page named 'Justice for Harambe' has more than 150,000 likes as of June 3, 2016.

It is saddening to see the outrageous comments and support to an animal over the life of a 4 year old, who accidently fell in to the cage. Those who are against the killing are focused on two aspects. First, the gorilla should have been tranquilized only. Second, the mother or parents must have been more vigilant, and must be charged for negligence.

To address the first concern, tranquilizing the 400lb gorilla might turn out to be catastrophic to the child because it may take up to 10 minutes for the tranquilizer to become fully effective. The child might get killed! The second concern against parents is based on the assumption that the parents were negligent. Even when the parents are vigilant, toddlers can do some dangerous things. After all, this could have been an accident. While all life is worthy, a child's life must gain priority over a gorilla. How would this case be treated if it were our own child? Unfortunately, we live in a world where animals are worthier than humans. There are thousands of livestock killed daily for human consumption. What about justice for them?

While US is discussing the death of Harambe, another incident involving cows and humans occurred in Northern India. A man transporting cows was stopped, stripped and beaten brutally by a group of Hindu extremists. Cow is 'mother' to many! These outrageous actions occur only when

men from other religions are involved. Another Muslim man was killed a couple months back for eating beef. In this case, it is not the compassion to a dead animal that brought extreme reactions against humans. Rather, the ideology (mythology) and extremism that valued an animal more than humans.

A common factor in these two scenarios is the devaluing of human life for concepts, philosophies, theologies, etc. It is an explosion of self-righteousness and selfishness that has become the trademark of the 21st century human society. It is unfortunate that a human being cannot see the value of another human being. What if the blamer assumed to be the victim? Will their perspective change?

As Orthodox Christians, we should be fighting against such segregation and injustices. But sadly, our actions and thoughts are similar in many aspects. We may not beat or kill people physically, but many are wounded and killed psychologically and emotionally. Inequalities based on class, status, and resources are not unheard of in our community. A senior priest once compared Syrian Orthodox Christians to Brahmins, claiming an entitlement to hold a special status in the community. Many believers hold the same ideology. We are experts in segregating people based on different criteria including but not limited to education, marital status, etc.

All these fall under the aspect of devaluing of the human being. If there is no Jew or Greek, no slave or free in Christ Jesus (Gal 3:28) as St. Paul states, isn't it embarrassing for us to hold multiple claims we have for being peculiar? Or we should accept that we are really not in Christ! Incidents like these should become eye-openers to us, to value every person as the 'Image of God' and to love them regardless of their status. Let us not reduce the worth of any human being!
