Vicar's Message

St. Thomas' Uniqueness


We have imbibed the tradition of celebrating the memory of St. Thomas in July from the Edessan Church. No matter what the tradition is, it is important for me that I honor this great saint, apostle and my own father.

The Indian Church owes everything to St. Thomas.

Three factors make St. Thomas unique to us.

1. St. Thomas is the Founder of my Church: It is a matter of deep sentiments to me that my own Father, the founder of my own Church, the one who started the branch of the Body of Christ in Indian soil is my own pride and love. No one needs to tell me the importance of my father! I am so deeply connected to my father that he is by default a matter of memory to me. If anyone would try to convince me for the sake of some political gain that St. Thomas is not as important in comparison with another apostle, I would avoid an argument with that person because my conviction cannot be a matter to argue with someone else. Who would argue against the adversary who denies somebody's father? Only if someone is not sure about it.

In the case of St. Thomas, I can say St. Thomas is my father without any doubt. I



should know well who my father is. To argue to establish my father's fatherhood is foolishness. It is for this reason that I personally refused to honor the Antiochian Patriarch HH Jacob III, who in his Kalpana #203/1970 referred to St. Thomas as "not an Apostle because he was absent when Jesus gave Holy Spirit to all other Apostles." All other occasions of Jesus giving the authority to the Apostles and even the Pentecost was forgotten by the Patriarch! The Patriarch's misguided political statement was only to impose his power over the Indian Church. The result of such satanic statements found its impact on the Indian Orthodox Church: an irreparable division happened. Many scholars, spiritually minded and politically powerful people in that group, declaring allegiance to the Patriarch never showed any courage to speak against the Patriarch and dissociate themselves from him and his authority. They did not care for the fact that St. Thomas is

their own father who begat them in Christ. Even to this day the group showing allegiance to the Patriarch or the Patriarchs who were enthroned on the Antiochian See after HH Jacob III were unwilling to disown the Patriarch's unwarranted comment. I am sure St. Thomas is not the loser but those who disown him will be. We can only feel pity on those who disown his/her own father!

- 2. St. Thomas' Model is Unique: The very fact of leaving the Middle East to come to a place where his language was not known well, to travel that distance, to gather courage to preach Christ in an alien world where Christ is unheard of, and so on, St. Thomas stands out. No other apostle took that adventure. The greatest missionary apostle Paul did not face this much adversity. In addition, his mission was fulfilled the way the Lord desired, "not to be served but to serve and give his life as ransom". His death became a model to all Christians. Not just willing to forsake one's family, wealth, power, etc. but the very life itself make St. Thomas the perfect model. This is what is needed now. The Indian Church will succeed spiritually only if that Church will be ready to forsake everything including its life for Christ. There is no other model necessary.
- 3. St. Thomas' Mission is My Mission: To take up the mission that St. Thomas left behind is

to be taken by us. Nowadays we just give some money to some mission work or the mission board of the Church and sit quiet. The mission that St. Thomas had left for us is to witness the Lord in a world where the Lord is not known well. For those of us who live in America, this is relevant. America is known to the rest of the world as a Christian country but the majority of the Americans do not know Christ intimately or empirically. America is a secular country and a good majority of people are nominal Christians; and so, Christ is not witnessed here. Instead, day after day, the secular world is rejecting even prayers that existed in several institutions in America. Last week, a baseball coach was punished for saying prayer with his team! To bear witness to Christ is not a joke. By simply having the word "Christian" with the name of any Church will not make them Christians; they should bear witness to Christ. We are challenged now in our witness to Christ. Our inspiration is St. Thomas.

I hope and pray that the uniqueness of our patron Saint will challenge us today to live as true Christians.

Diocesan Assembly News:

Our diocese held its annual Diocesan Assembly meeting at Sts Baselios Gregorios Church in N. Plainfield, NJ on June 25th. Representing our parish, our Vicar and the elected delegates (Abraham K. Varughese, Binny Cherian, and Oommen Kappil) attended the meeting.

The meeting agenda included Annual GB, accounts and annual report, Budget for 2022-23 and Election of the new Diocesan Council.

Two significant decisions came out of the Assembly:

1. Clergy Salary: Minimum salary of clergy was increased by \$800 per month. There will be an

- annual cost of living increase of 2% in subsequent years.
- 2. Diocese will appoint a full time Youth Minister to lead the Campus Ministry.

Diocesan Council Election:

Diocesan Council consists of two priests and four laymen who are elected by the Diocesan Assembly, along with the Diocesan Secretary. The election was held on June 25th. The following members were elected to the Council for the next five years (2022-27):
