Vicar's Message

THE ADVENT SEASON

Christmas season is generally known as the Advent Season. The word "advent" means arrival. This word can be attached to any other events to indicate the beginning or arrival of something. However, this word is generally or popularly used for the 'arrival of the Messiah' season or Christmas. Thus, we call the lent season prior to Christmas as advent lent. All Christian groups take this season seriously and have special observances and programs leading to Christmas. In the Orthodox, Catholic, or High Anglican traditions this observance coincides with special dietary restriction spiritual discipline of prayer, meditation, and spiritual exercise. We, the Orthodox, try our best to observe this lent.

The advent season is truly a meaningful time for those who take Jesus seriously. Even though the birth of Jesus took place 2000 years ago, the birth of Jesus is a daily experience to the believer. Every day when we wake up, we can have that experience of



Jesus born into our life with divine power boiling in us. Or, before we go to bed the same experience of the immediate presence of the Lord we can invoke. During this lent people give special attention to all kinds of lent-related observances like prayer, meditation, and dietary restrictions with special songs that impart joy. Events like caroling, decorating, and sharing gifts adds to our joy and finally we attend the worship on Christmas Day with special songs that remind us the nostalgic experience of the Lord's coming. Thus, the advent season becomes a time of joyful tidings.

Christmas is indeed the greatest festival of the world crossing over to all religions and cultures because of its business value. I am sometimes amused that the atheistic world, the non-Christian world, and the secular world are working so hard preparing materials for the celebration of the birth of Christ! If only they knew who this Jesus was! All that they know is that Jesus brings in money through this celebration. Without losing any money, without any effort to affirm faith in a God, one can earn something. The modern world has learned how to navigate through life without God in their life. The significance of Christmas does not go beyond the material realm.

In fact, what does Jesus do while looking at all these celebrations? Even though this world is full of evil, hatred, and violence, He stands next to us with a smile, pleading for love and care. Whether it is a grand or humble celebration, Jesus would like to come into it and accept it with a loving

smile and affectionate pat. He makes all our celebrations a highly potential opportunity to love. He doesn't need an invitation to our parties or celebrations if they are all done in love. He is there. He does not make conditions. If so, He would not have come down to us and become one like us. We don't have the qualification to host Him but He still comes to us out of His endless love. His promise is, "Lo I am with you to the end of the world." Thus, our Christmas becomes a real advent or arrival of Jesus into our own situations. Let us welcome Him into our life.
