### Assistant Vicar's Message

### Cross in Great Lent and Holy Week

#### Introduction

Great Lent is a time of special focus on the cross. The death and resurrection of Jesus are symbolized in the cross. In other words, the cross is a presence of Christ and the gospel. It also represents everything that we gain through Christ: salvation, discipleship, and victory. The cross is present in all our worship including kauma, trisagion, creed, etc. During Great Lent the cross is commemorated on Mid-Lent and Good Friday.

#### 1. Mid-Lent

**Mnortho:** At the middle of Great Lent, a special object called **Mnortho** (or Golgotha) is placed in the middle of the church nave. A cross is placed on top of Mnortho. The Mnortho recalls the words of Jesus: "And as

Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up" (John 3:14). Jesus is referring back to the elevation of bronze serpent in the wilderness (Numbers 21:8-9). Anyone who was bitten by a venomous snake was healed when they looked at the bronze serpent. In the same way we are healed from the deadly venom of sin if we look to Our Lord on the cross (see Psalm 34:5). The Mnortho journeys with us from middle of church to front of church at Holy Week, then into the altar (madhbaha) from Easter to Ascension. (Calculate how many days in a year the Mnortho is in the church.)

#### 2. Good Friday

**Veneration of Cross**: Good Friday service includes a special service of the veneration of the cross. The service of the Veneration of Cross follows the ninth hour prayers. The opening prayer (sluzo) reminds us of our responsibility to carry the cross (see Luke 9:23).

"May we, in compliance with Your supreme command, carry Your Cross on our shoulders in a Christian-like manner, always ready to mortify our members which are on earth and live in You in the fear of God" (Good Friday, Veneration of Cross, Sluzo; see Galatians 5:24). This service concludes with **adoration of the cross** by all the faithful. The hymn sung at the time of the adoration reminds us that Christ gave us salvation through the cross:

"We bow before Your Cross, Which brought salvation for our souls, And we – cry out with the thief, O Christ, "Remember us when – You – Come!"" (Luke 23:42)

#### 3. Exaltation of Cross

**Exaltation of Cross**: Several of major feasts of the Lord include a special service called **exaltation of the cross**. The celebrant takes a cross and blesses four sides symbolizing the blessing of the entire universe by the cross. To exalt means to raise to a higher rank. The physical exaltation of the cross signifies the supreme importance the cross should have in our lives. In Malankara, the feasts with the exaltation service include feast of Nativity, Baptism of our Lord, Palm Sunday, Mid-Lent, Good Friday, Resurrection (Easter), Ascension. The consecration of church also includes exaltation service.

#### 4. King Abgar and Mid-Lent:

At Mid-Lent we also remember the healing of King Abgar of Edessa by Christ. Edessa was an important city on the border between Roman Empire and Persian Empire. The Persian Empire was located East of Roman Empire and was governed initially by Parthian dynasty (and later by Sasanid dynasty). At various times another small kingdom known as Kingdom of Edessa existed between Roman Empire and Persian Empire. King Abgar was the king of Edessa at the time of Jesus' ministry. According to early Christian historians including Eusebius of Caesarea, King Abgar was afflicted with leprosy, and though was isolated and far away from Jesus Christ, sought a way to find healing from Jesus. In exchange of letters between our Lord Jesus Christ and King Abgar, our Lord took a cloth and used it to wash His face and sent it with a letter to King Abgar. Christ stated that he would send one of His disciples after He ascends to complete his healing totally. When King Abgar received the letter and cloth, he placed that cloth on his face and had partial healing. After the Ascension, St. Thaddeus (Mar Addai), one of the seventy-two evangelists visited King Abgar to complete his healing from leprosy. Edessa (also known as Urha) became an important center for Syriac Christianity.
