# Vicar's Message

# How to Prepare for Christ

We are in the Advent Season now. Just finished with the great festival of Thanksgiving and now getting ready to celebrate the miracle of Incarnation, Christmas! In fact, our greatest reason for Thanksgiving is the fact of the greatest gift that God gave to the entire humanity, His own Son! In the Holy Eucharist (this word was derived from Greek word. Eucharisto {ευχαριστώ} meaning 'thanks') we are thanking God for giving His Son through the Holy Body and Blood of Christ in the Holy Qurbana. Jesus used this word thanks when instituted the Holy Eucharist, as we see in Matthew 26:27, Mark 14:23 and Luke 22:19. The priest recites this at the time of blessing the bread and wine (Baare... Kadesh..). Thus in the Holy Eucharist we remember the gift of God in a very personal way, accepting Him in true flesh and blood and therefore, Christmas is implied in every Holy Qurbana.

However, Christmas is also a historic moment that we celebrate on December 25th. The entire world is now in the celebration that has already begun. Even people who don't believe in God or in Jesus make all the ingredients to celebrate the



birth of God in Jesus through the ornaments, illumination materials or special culinary stuff. Streets, homes, offices and shops are all beautifully decorated indicating the arrival of this festival. As a spiritual community what can we do beyond all these material type celebrations to make it a real festival of receiving the Messiah?

1. Spiritual Illumination: While decorating our places with beautiful lights we should also be lighting up our own life. There is a lot of darkness in each one of us. Darkness hides our sight. Often, we won't see our weaknesses and frailties because of this darkness. We just assume that all is well with what we do. We are masked by satan making it impossible to see our own mistakes. Many of our habits, styles of life, approaches to others, and behaviors are all without seeing the way of Christ, or the Word of Christ. Satan has masked us very successfully to see the sins that are

hidden in us. The only solution is to have the enlightenment of Christ which will give us the light to see our inner secrets that are buried in sin and frailty. In the same we are also masked by Satan making us blind to see the needs of the poor and the destitute. We have the eyes to see our own needs and wants but not the essentials of the needy. Often we spend on our luxury than our essentials. When Jesus asked us to love our neighbor like ourselves, he was putting the light in us to see the needs of the needy. Can this Christmas open our eyes to see our own self and the needs of others?

2. Spiritual **Ornamentation**: Using various ornamentation for Christmas in and around our homes or offices, we are trying to make it look beautiful. Indeed, we want our environment looks beautiful. But are we aware of the need of decorating our own life with ornaments of good deeds and good behavior or good life style? Don't we need others to see us glowing with virtues of Christ? Our external appearance with beauty kits only makes us physically beautiful but can we make us beautiful with our character, loving others with a special love that Jesus imparted? Often the externally beautiful or handsome people are carrying a lot of darkness in their life.

But the light of Jesus can make us glow in a special way.

3. Spiritual gifts: Gift-giving is one of the major activities in the Christmas celebration. Again the symbolic expression that God showed us by giving His own Son to the world is expressed in our giving gifts or sharing our resources with others. Every gift is a great sign of sharing. While we give material gifts to others we should also be mindful of giving spiritual gifts to others. St. Paul teaches us the 9 spiritual gifts in Galatians 5:22 as fruit of the Spirit. Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control! During the Christmas season we can give these gifts to others without spending a penny. Unfortunately, today's world does not want to give this valuable gift which is the least expensive! What a tragedy! The Holy Spirit has given us all these gifts and why not we share the same with others?

May this Christmas be a special one for all of us, understanding the meaning of true Christmas!


