## Vicar's Message

# Lenten Season and the Culmination in the Resurrection of our Lord

A great season for spiritual uplift will be over by March 31<sup>st</sup>. Those who have used this very important season for their spiritual growth will definitely be benefited by that. Quite a number of people must have observed seriously these days with restriction on diet, behavior, and increased time for prayer and Bible reading. Indeed, some did take an extra step to do some humanitarian acts helping the needy. It gives a great pleasure to us when we do

the above without compulsion. And the lent becomes a fruitful time of edification and enrichment. It helps the growth of our mind body and spirit. I hope it will make some permanent changes in our

life.

During the Holy Week we make extra effort for longer hours of prayer and meditation. The Holy Week brings home our memories of the Lord's suffering for humanity. Even though the Cross was a humiliating symbol during the first century because the Romans used it as

the cruelest way of punishing the most serious criminals, Jesus converted that into a symbol of ultimate love and sacrifice. Christians, at least from the 4th century took the Cross as their symbol. In the first century itself the Biblical authors, especially St. Paul, highlighted the Cross as a symbol of ultimate sacrifice and means of salvation for the entire world. It was not simply as a sign, but as a serious concept of depicting Love in its perfect sense. In the book to the Galatians St. Paul asked, "O foolish Galatians, who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ has been evidently set forth, crucified for you?" (3:1) He further states in 6:14, "but God forbid that I should glory save in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me and I unto the Lord". This message imparts the divine knowledge that when we are

> experiencing this Cross in our life taking the suffering of others, we are identifying ourselves with the Lord.

In Philippians 2:8 St. Paul again highlights the humility of the Lord to accept the ultimate sacrifice even to the death on the Cross which made him the greatest among all humans. Even today we

have not seen another person who has emptied himself like our Lord making it possible for us to acquire salvation by identifying ourselves with Him. Indeed, there were people who suffered like Christ or more that what Christ suffered, such as the genocides by Roman Emperors, Hitler or other religiously intolerant fanatics, Jesus stands as a model for all of them showing perfect love even on the culmination of suffering on the Cross. This is the best lesson for us to learn from Jesus that we bring glory to His name by taking up the Cross on a daily basis. Christians of the present time are shying away from this part of the Cross even though they are happy to wear a pricy metallic Cross on their neck!

Indeed, it was the Cross that led to the ultimate glory of Christ who could overcome death through His resurrection giving us the promise that death is not the end of everything. Any suffering has a resurrection. This is our hope as Christians. The early Christians survived as a live community simply on this faith of

eternal life. They were willing to give life for the sake of Christ because of this hope. Unimaginable persecution from the Jewish community and Roman emperors could not deter the spirit of Christians to waver in their faith. They accepted death happily. This is our challenge today. Many Christians are not even willing to give some time for Christ, let alone to die for Christ. The Early Christians gives us the inspiration to live and die for Christ.

I hope and pray that our 50-day lent was a great experience and fruitful for all of us.
