Vicar's Message

Festival of the Holy Cross

September 14th is the Festival of

the Holy Cross. In the 'qolo' of

the Kukilion of the Holy

Cross, it has the brief story of the discovery of the

cross on which Jesus was

crucified. In the history

books it is noted that in the

year 326 AD, Helene the

Queen, mother of Emperor

Constantine discovered the

Holy Cross in Jerusalem. It was

believed to be a miraculous event

because when the three crosses were discovered it was not possible to identify the

cross on which the Lord was crucified. The

story continues that a respectable lady who was

very sick unto death was healed by touching the original cross, thus the cross became a

venerable piece of relic.

Already in the life of Emperor Constantine the sign of the cross was a miracle worker. It was recorded in history that Constantine during an early morning sun worship, saw a cross on the sun and heard a voice saying to him, "conquer with this." Constantine was under the burden of an impending war which is later known as the

Milvian Bridge War in 312 AD. Following

the vision, he used the sign of the

cross on all war equipment, flags,

chariots and horses and eventually won the war.

Thus, the cross became a

sign of victory.

From the early centuries cross became the symbol of Christianity. Some people built the belief around that it can cast out demons. Many

movies the cross was depicted as a source of exorcism. Some reportedly used to keep it under the pillow of sick children for healing. There is a famous story of St. Gregorios of Parumala, casting out demons in the nearby Hindu worship area called 'kavu'. Another story, when one foreigner was trying to take a photo of St. Gregorios, the sunlight was too

much, and His Grace raised the cross to have some cloud cover the sun for a better picture. These are stories transferred from one generation to the other without the possibility of any verification. In any case, there is a miraculous nature around the cross whether it is made of gold or other metals, wood or concrete. It is in the Church tradition. And it is strong. For that reason alone, the 'veneration' of the cross on Good Friday is of great significance to the believers. As a result of these beliefs, the cross became part of the life of Christians of apostolic tradition. Also, wearing the cross as a pendant, engraving it on the wedding 'thali', using crosses for every sacramental or liturgical occasion and prayers etc. is a normal practice. Needless to say, the use of cross on church steeples, inside the church building especially on the altar, liturgical books, vestments, church buildings etc. became common. For the Orthodox Christian, when they pass by a cross or a church that has a cross on the building, they will bow down and make the sign of the cross. In addition, we also make the sign of cross before meals, before anything important that we do every day, such as starting a day setting out from the home or starting the vehicle.

Strictly speaking, what is the miracle that the cross works? It is nothing but the unfailing, unconditional, and sacrificial love that Christ exhibited on the cross. The willingness to pray for his enemies, as He taught us, to forgive his adversaries (Father forgive them as they do not know what they are doing) and His own words, "If any man would come after me let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me," (Luke 9:23.) This miracle working ability is left to the Christians to emulate in their personal and community life. There is nothing greater that the divine love which the Lord has instilled in our life when accepted Him as our redeemer and savior at the baptism. From that status we work miracles everv day when unconditional love is poured out to the rest of the people obeying our Lord, "Love your neighbor like yourself." May all those who wear a cross around their necks make sure that they are wearing the great symbol of ultimate sacrificial love!

Lost and Found: Many small items such as jewelry and watches have been submitted to the office "Lost and Found". Please see the Secretary if you believe you may be missing one of these items.




Life Events Announcements
